# REPORT OF THE POSTMASTER-GENERAL AND GENERAL MANAGER OF TELEGRAPHS FOR THE YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1893.

THE HONOURABLE THE COLONIAL SECRET.RY,

SIR,-

I beg to submit my Report on the Postal and Telegraph Departments for the year from the 1st July, 1892, to the 30th June, 1893.

1. I forward the usual returns.

#### POSTAL DEPARTMENT.

- 2. The total postal earnings taken to credit amounted to £46,139 17s. 4d., and the total expenditure charged to £49,670 fs. 9d., giving a balance against the department of £3,530 9s. 5d.
- 3. The cash receipts of the department were £38,064 19s. 6d., but there is still to be received on account of 1892-93 the postage owing from the United Kingdom and foreign countries for the conveyance of correspondence over the Colonies' ocean lines. The amount of this postage has not yet been calculated, as, in terms of the International Convention, the postage payable by the different Union countries to each other is arrived at from triennial returns, and the return for the years 1892, 1893, and 1894, commenced last month, is not yet completed. The foreign postage receivable by the Colony for the year 1892-93, it is expected, will be not less than £5,000.
- 4. The revenue received during the year from the 1st of July, 1891, to the 30th of June, 1892, excluding an item belonging to the previous year, was £46,082 5s. 2d., and it may be assumed that the cash earnings—including postage still to be received—in 1892-93 will show a falling-off as compared with those of 1891-92 of a little over £3,000. In Jannary, 1892, a number of reductions had been made, and it was estimated that the loss of revenue from entering the Universal Postal Union on the 1st of July, 1892, would be about £1,430 for the year 1892-93. Reductions would, perhaps, be responsible for a falling-off of £1,750, and the balance of loss may, I think, be put down to the depression in commercial circles which prevailed throughout the Colony.
- 5. It was under "Sale of Postage Stamps, Postage, and Surcharges" that the falling-off principally occurred. The decrease in other items collectively amounted to £124 19s. 2d. only.
- 6. The credit taken by the department for services for which it is not paid amounted to £8,074 17s. 10d., as compared with £7,465 19s. 3d. the previous year.

7. Under Expenditure, salaries advanced to £8,832 5s. 9d. from £9,387 4s. 11d.; contingent and other expenses fell to £1,778 9s. 9d. from £1.859 19 1d., mais advanced to £37,203 1s. 8d. from £36,629 4s. 8d.; miscellaneous cl. £1,866 9s. 7d. from £1,902 14s. 4d.; and rent fell to £490 from £555 6s. 84.

The Colony has still to pay the postage due from it to other countries for the year. The amount will, perhaps, be a little in excess of £300.

9. The following items of expenditure from postal votes do not form a proper charge against the Post Office, and I have not, there is included them in the Debit and Credit Statement:—

- 10. Traffic generally fell off considerably as compared with 1891-92. The total number of articles conveyed was 6,519,160, as against 7,138,686. In registered articles there was a slight increase, the number dealt with being 70,073, as against 70,005. Money orders issued numbered 27,339, representing an amount of £89,328 8s. 4d. as against a number of 31,001 and an amount of £68,493 18s. 8d. Money orders paid numbered 21,918, representing an amount of £65,632 2s. 10d., as against a number of 19,868 and an amount of £59,126 2s. 4d. Private boxes let fell to 565 from 588, and private bags to 125 from 126. The fees received on account of private boxes and bags amounted to £758 16s. 7d. as compared with £790 7s. 9d. Government departments appropriated 74 boxes and 9 bags, representing an amount of £87 3s.; and the approximate value of Government correspondence dealt with was £4,227 14s.
- 11. A post office was established at Upper Tongaat in place of the agency previously existing there, and a new agency was opened at the Greyville railway station.
- 12. The Polela post office was removed to the village of Bulwer and re-named "Bulwer." The offices at Inhluzani, Hond Bosch Rand, and Wallacetown were re-named, respectively, "Impendible," "Curry's Post," and "Inchanga."
- 13. On the 30th of June there were open for the transaction of business 155 post offices, 32 ordinary postal agencies, and 25 postal agencies at railway stations; and the total number of persons employed by the department was 355.
- 14. The Colony entered the Universal Postal Union on the 1st of July, and adopted the initial rates of the Union to all countries of the world ontside South Africa from that date. It

has since been practicable to send a letter weighing not more than half an ounce to the most distant part of the universe over sea for 2½d., and to most, though not all countries, a post-card can be sent for 1d., or, with reply prepaid, for 2d.

- 15. The rates chargeable by the Natal Post Office had been undergoing gradual reduction for a length of time, and when it was ultimately decided to enter the Postal Union the prospective loss for the first year—the heaviest yearly loss anticipated—was but £1,430.
- 16. The Inland rates for Book and Sample Packets were assimilated to those of the Postal Union, the minimum rate of a half-penny for both commercial papers and samples being retained, from the 15th of July.
  - 17. Inland Reply Cards were introduced from the 21st of February.
- 18. More liberal regulations in regard to the use of post-cards were issued on the 18th of March.
- 19. The Cape Colony, though not in the Postal Union, expressed its readiness to furnish acknowledgments of the delivery of registered articles from the 21st of November, and the Natal office, from this date, undertook to obtain such acknowledgments from Cape offices at the Union charge of  $2\frac{1}{2}$ d.
- 20. From the 1st of November arrangements were made for the interchange of three-Palfpenny post-cards with Bechuanaland, the Bechuanaland Protectorate, the Trans Protectorate, and Mashonaland.
- 21. From the 1st of January arrangements were made with the Cape Colony and Bechn land for the interchange of reply paid post-cards.
- 22. Intimation was received that the South African Republic entered the Universal Postal Union on the 1st of January—six months subsequently to the entry of Natal.
- 23. Numerous alterations were made in the Native Runner Services of the Department during the year.
- 24. The post-cart service between Umzimkulu and Hard 1g was made a daily one (excluding Sunday) from the 1st of January; and a post-cart service between Pietermaritzburg and Polela, by way of Edendale, Boston, and Deepdale, was established on the 16th September. Polela had previously been served six times a week by way of Ixopo, and Boston and Deepdale six times a week by way of Howick railway station, runners being employed beyond the points mentioned, but a majority of those concerned were anxious to get a closer connection with Pietermaritzburg, and to secure this were prepared to submit to a reduced service.
  - 25. The following new contracts for post-cart services were entered into during the year :--

For a service threatimes a week for one year between Pietermaritzburg and Bulwer. Mr. John Welch, Contractor. Subsidy, £700 per annum.

- For a service six times a week for three years between Harding and Umzimkulu.

  Mr. John Welch, Contractor. Subsidy, £400 per annum.
- For a service six times a week for three years between Isipingo and Umzinto. Mr. R. Redman, Contractor. Subsidy £500 per annum.
- I service twice a week for five years between Dandes and Vrijheid. Mr. T. J. Botha, Contractor. Subsidy, £300 per annum. Two-thirds of the cost of this service is borne by the Transvaal Department, which entered into the ract with Mr. Botha, two-thirds of the distance traversed being in Transvaal territory.
- 26. The completion of the Railway to Harrismith on the 13th July afforded a complete service by train to and from that place, in lieu of a service partly by train and partly by post-cart.
- 27. Improved connections in the Orange Free State from the 1st of January admitted of a closer connection overland with the Mail steamer at Capetown, and the Supplementary English and Foreign Mail, forwarded weekly by way of Bloemfontein, has since been despatched from both Pietermaritzburg and Durban as late as Saturday night.
- 28. For several months a sorting-van was employed on the Railway between Newcastle and Charlestown, but it was ultimately discontinued as a matter of economy, and because it was found to afford but very trifling advantage on account of the limited quantity of matter treated in it.
- 29. The Mail signal gnns in Pietermaritzburg, which were thought to have become of little service to the public, owing to the introduction of the street delivery of correspondence, were discontinued on the 22nd of August, without, apparently, any inconvenience being experienced.
- 30. Posts were much interfered with by the heavy rains which fell during December, January, February, and the early part of March. The ervices to the Lower Tugela and Eshowe were most affected, but delays occurred on the Polela and Umzimkulu lines. There were also interruptions in the Transval which affected Natal connections.
- 31. Foreign Parcels traffic largely increased in one direction, and fell off slightly in the other. There were received in the Colony 15,058 parcels, as against 9,216 the previous year; and 2,781 parcels were despatched from the Colony, as against 2,900 in 1891-92.
- 32. The Customs Dues collected by the Post Office on behalf of the Customs Department on parcels entering the Colony amounted to £1,791 ls. 3d.
- 33. On articles received in the Colony by Letter-Post, Customs Dues to the amount of £97 0s. 10d. were collected by the Post Office and transferred to the Customs Department.
- 34. The business done in connection with Postal Drafts was again very small. Seven Drafts were issued in the course of the year, but only two of them were honoured.

- 35. A total of 25,262 letters were re-issued from the Returned Letter Branch of the Department.
  - 36. The majority of the principal offices were again inspected.

- 37. A native employed in the Telegraph Branch at Harding was convicted on the 25th c. January of stealing a Registered letter at the Harding Post Office on the 25th of the previous month, and was sentenced to pay a fine of £20, or to undergo six months' imprisonment.
- 38. I have furnished information relative to the voyages of the Mail steamers to Natal in tabular form. It will be seen from this that the shortest time taken from Capetown to Natal was 50 hours 36 minutes, and the longest 139 hours 29 minutes; that the earliest arrival before time was 118 hours 32 minutes in advance of such time, and that on three occasions there were arrival after contract time, the longest delay being 22 hours 59 minutes.

#### TELEGRAPH DEPARTMENT.

- 39. The total earnings of the Telegraph Department amounted to £18,968 6s. 7d., while the total expenditure was £17,439 9s. 6d. There was thus a balance in favour of the Department of £1,528 17s. 1d.
- 40. There were important decreases in general traffic, as in the Post Office, but in cable traffic there was an appreciable increase. The forwarded telegrams of all stations numbered 210,034, as compared with 227,120 the previous year. Received messages numbered 220,167, as compared with 230,281 the previous year. The transmitted telegrams of all stations, including second transmissions, advanced to 517,718 from 512,052 in 1891-92. The total falling-off in numbers was 21,534. The value of Government work increased to £4,380 16s. 2d. from £4,156 16s.; and Revenue decreased to £14,587 10s. 5d. from £15,459 5s. 63. The total decrease in the earnings of the Department amounted to £647 14s. 11d.
- 41. The total number of Ocean telegrams dealt with was 39,436. There were transferred to the two companies 19,533 messages, and received from them 19,903. The payments to the two companies amounted to £55,801 €s. 6d., and the receipts for the overland transmission of Ocean telegrams amounted to £1,258 11s. 8d.
- 42. The total expenditure of the Department was £17,439 9s. 6d., as compared with. £17,373 4s. 3d. the previous year.
- 43. The total number of offices open for the transaction of telegraphic business on the 30th Jnne was 77. This number included the Railway telegraph office at Albertina in the Orange Free State, which, by arrangement with the General Manager of Railways, is under the supervision of this Department.

- 44. Three offices were opened in the course of the year, viz., Albertina, Berea Road, and Clairmont.
  - 45. The total number of persons employed by the Department on the 30th June was 201.
  - 46. The Eastern and Western Cables were interrapted during the year as under:— Eastern Cable from 4th to 11th, and 22nd to 26th January;
    Western Cable from 1st to 23rd July: 11th to 21st September; 23rd November to 12th January; 10th to 25th April; and 30th May to 30th June.
- 47. Numerous alterations and improvements were carried out by the Engineering officers, and the lines and apparatus were maintained throughout the year in thoroughly good order.
- 48. The work continued to be treated with every desirable expedition, and error was also at a minimum.
